Transfer Task: Plideshow Presentation

You will be designing a slideshow with your "home" tribe to share with your "away" team. Each team member will be responsible for creating one slide for the presentation. Each slide pertains to one section that you researched about your tribe such as:

- Geographic Location (Where they lived)
- Food & Resources
- Shelter
- Clothing/Attire
- Government/Religion (Beliefs)
- What Happened to Them?



Each presentation can be found on the class Weebly page under the current unit and activity list by class. Just click on your tribe and that will link you to the pre-created slideshow.

There is a how-to video titled "How to Create/Edit a Slideshow" that will provide you with further instructions on how to build your presentation.
